# **Supreme Court Cases**

<u>Roper v. Simmons</u> (2005) - capital punishment of juvenile offenders is unconstitutional <u>Graham v. Florida</u> (2009) - life without parole of juvenile offenders in non-homicide cases is unconstitutional

<u>Miller v. Alabama</u> (2012) - mandatory life without parole of juvenile offenders in homicide cases is unconstitutional unless the juvenile is found "permanently incorrigible" <u>Montgomery v. Louisiana</u> (2016) - applies Miller v. Alabama retroactively
